INTRODUCTION

Money. Who doesn't want a bit more of it? If you're saving for a down payment, planning a wedding, attempting to pay off your debt— well, will those student loans ever go away? Your day's work can help you pay for the essentials.

But the side-hustle from home, that's the game-changer that's going to make a difference in your pocket while giving you the freedom you've always wanted. So, here are some of the best side hustles that will help you make more money.

So just prepare your mind. Dedicate at least 3-4 days a week to your hustle. Pick one hustle at a time. Master one and then move on. Keep your head down for at least two months.

I would strongly recommend you only share with one person. This would be an accountability partner.

HUSTLE 1: START YOUR OWN YOUTUBE CHANNEL

Youtubers are today's self-made entertainers — people that have gained an audience by making content that's aimed at educating, entertaining, reviewing, and being cool on the internet. Many of these small-screen celebs do what they're doing just to do it, scratch it and make something happen and be in front of the camera. Making money may not be your motivation to start a YouTube channel, but the opportunities to make a living are a nice surprise when you know how many of them there are.

- **Plan Your Contents**

You have probably already decided on the kind of video content you want to present before even developing your YouTube channel. Keeping your content interesting and entertaining is also the best way to increase your thoughts and gain followers; the more viewers can connect to it, the more they would want to click on it and watch until the end.

It also helps to stick, if you have one, to your theme. Many famous YouTubers, for example, have dedicated channels for travel, tutorials, or their everyday lives. Via the people they watch, audiences want to live vicariously, so let them know what they can expect and offer interesting content they can enjoy.

Find a niche that you feel comfortable talking about. Do some research on other videos which are similar. Check their viewers and take notes on their likability factor. Apply some of the elements to your channel. Accept all feedback and improve as you go along.

HUSTLE 2: RENT OUT A ROOM ON AIRBNB

To most, their side hustle is their home. That's correct, renting out your place at sites like Airbnb, Homeaway and Vrbo can be a perfect way of earning cash using an existing asset: your home.

- **Spruce Up The Spot**

Even if your home is the best place for you, it may not be for the visitors. Any redecoration is normally in order. Experts suggest starting with a blank slate and then furnishing the room for the best results. Free it from the clutter.

HUSTLE 3: BECOME A HOST ONLINE ON AIRBNB

Airbnb now have a hosting experience. Become a host online. Can you cook? Are you good at telling amazing stories whilst doing hair? Although you might already be an expert on hosting experiences, hosting one online comes with its own collection of complexities and considerations. Even if you've already set up your audio and video, thought about writing your experience page that you're familiar with, changed your price and availability based on your online format, and are in the middle of getting to know Zoom, maybe the trickiest part of hosting an online experience is in front of your camera.

To help you become an attractive host and meet (and ideally exceed) the expectations for online experience, here are some tips and best practices that need to be followed before and after you enter the spotlight.

Most of the effort it takes to be successful in front of the camera is going on behind it. As you plan for your online experience, keep these points in mind before you start shooting:

- **Dress Up The Part.**

What looks amazing in real life doesn't always look like that on a camera. Solid colours work well, while apparel that is black and white, striped, patterned, or has logos may not be as well.

- **Get Organized.**

You ask the guests to come to your prepared experience, so do the same and "stage" all before you go live. Have all the ingredients, equipment, or props you need within reach and ready to go.

- **Do The Homework.**

Look through the guest list and start reading the profile of each guest in advance. This can help you remember names (and even where they come from!) that can make people feel welcomed and promote deeper connections.

- **Take A Deep Breath.**

It's easy to talk fast or hurry when you're anxious, so try to slow down and find moments of pause. This is particularly helpful for guests who speak other languages or need more time.

- **Forget About Perfection.**

Guests tend to be individual and relatable. Often it means owning a minor mistake or smiling at uncomfortable moments. It's easier to be relaxed and confident than to be formal or rigid.

- **Let Your Uniqueness Shine Out.**

Be very wet. Be dumb. Be on your own and have fun! Think of hosting more of a chat or activity with friends (those you haven't met yet), less of a severe lecture or lesson.

- **Think About Co-Hosting.**

Team members can help make the online experience more dynamic and appealing to the guests. If a co-host handles messages in a chat room or controls a monitor, it will help ensure that guests do not miss any action.

HUSTLE 4: BECOME A VIRTUAL ASSISTANT

Working as a virtual assistant is a realistic and potentially lucrative way to make money online. You can work from home, stay in contact with your clients via e-mail, instant messaging, phone, and video conferencing.

Search for unique items, buy them and resale them for a higher amount. If you have a small amount of money start on AliExpress or Alibaba. Look for items on eBay and other marketplace that are in high demand, order in bulk and sell for a lower price on eBay or other sites. You can offer wholesale discounts to businesses too.

HUSTLE 7: BECOME A TRANSCRIBER

If you're looking for a full-time income, or just some extra cash from a side hustle, learning how to make money as a transcriptionist may be just something for you. There are quite a few online companies offering transcription jobs and, for most of them, the only qualifications are programming knowledge and fairly good typing skills.

If you really want to make money as a transcriptionist, but you've never done transcription work before, don't just give up! Many of these companies offer you a little study guide when you sign up. This way, you can get an idea of the formats and styles used before you take their input samples. The entire process of training and taking the entrance exam takes less time than it takes to get out to some office and sit down for an interview.

If this is the first time you've been searching for a transcription job, bear in mind that it may take some time to find the right company you want to work for. Payment can also vary based on employment and skills, but transcription is a legal way to make some extra money. Here are my best options for businesses to help you make money as a transcriptionist:

TranscribeMe

For people wanting to start transcribing, TranscribeMe may be the first place you want to apply for. There are no qualifications for prior experience at TranscribeMe, but if you have any background in medicine or law, you might be qualified for higher paid jobs. On average, transcribers can earn around GBR193 a month, and their top transcribers can earn more than GBR1700. You should expect your pay to be between GBR5 and GBR15 per audio hour.

Projects on this website would be shorter than 1 to 2 minute audio clips that you need to transcribe, making it one of the most

challenging tasks on our list. Once you have completed your tasks, you can expect to receive your payment via PayPal or bank transfer once a month. If you're interested in TranscribeMe, just apply, register, and take the entrance exam. Once authorized, start writing!

GoTranscript

GoTranscript is another transcription service that has versatile specifications with a fair rate of pay. Typical turnaround time for a 10 minute media clip is approximately 6 hours, so even if your typing skills aren't brilliant, this is a perfect way to gain some experience.

GoTranscript costs around GBRO.4 per audio minute, or the time it takes for you to transcribe one minute of audio recordings. One thing freelancers love about GoTranscript is their lack of a weekly quota that you have to make every week, which means you can work as much or as little as you want. You can also access your pay through PayPal or Payoneer on a weekly basis.

GMR Transcription

GMR Transcription is a very popular transcription website because it doesn't require any prior experience and pays between GBRO.50 and GBR1.00 per audio minute, making it one of the highest paid ones on our list. For applicants looking at this business, you will need a foot pedal, an MS Office, a headset and a high-speed Internet connection.

The entrance exam will be applied, which all applicants must pass. When you have, there is a probationary period before you can start paying for your transcript. What this means is that you have to transcribe a total of 2 hours of audio before collecting your invoice. After that, as long as you do a minimum of 4 audio hours a month, you're good to go.

Rev

Last on our list is a transcription platform that has consistently high availability, Rev. They currently have over 60,000 freelancers working for them at any time, and over 100,000 global clients. The reason why most people want to make money as a transcriptionist with Rev is that they provide several different platform types that you can transcribe.

You'll get your pick of over 100 projects that are posted every day that can be lectures, podcasts, documented interviews, and even focus group notes. The wide variety of jobs available is what keeps people coming back to Rev. You should expect your pay to be between GBRO.2 to GBRO.8 per minute of audio and pay your PayPal account on a weekly basis.

How To Boost Your Earnings As A Transcriber

If you really want to make money as a transcriptionist, the most important thing you can do for yourself is to be reliable. If you've been a legal or medical assistant in your past life, you're going to be sluggish in the beginning. You can't let that deter you, because there's a chance to make some decent money!

Think of the first time you've learned how to type a QWERTY keyboard. You haven't been quick at all. You've been hunting keys and pecking them with your pointers. You can type so well now that you're reading an article about being an at-home transcriptionist.

The same will be true of the first time you get started. Yeah, you're using a regular keyboard, but the style will be different from what you'd use to type an email or Facebook reaction. But you're going to get quicker over time. You'll start earning more as you get quicker.
